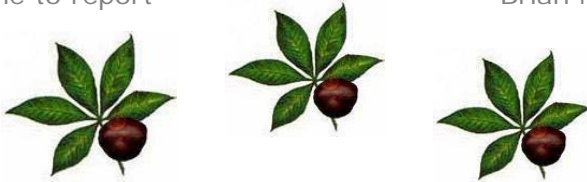

Supervisors by definition are Mentors and Coaches, they are tasked with providing the tools for you to do your job better and in helping you to personally improve in order to reach your Career

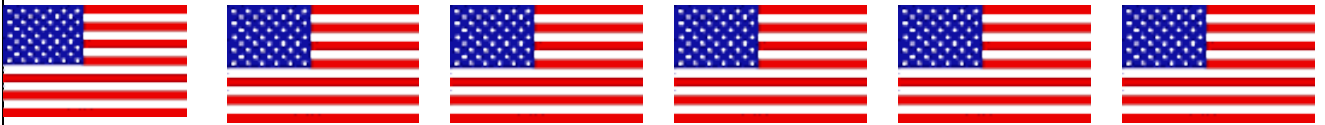

## ATTENTION BUCKEYE CHAPTER CDFMs

### Have You Renewed Your Certification Within The Last 2 Years?

According to Ms Claudia Carr, Associate Director for **Certification at American Society of Military Comptrollers, ASMC** is changing their Certified Defense Financial Managers (CDFM) renewal policy. In an effort to ensure that CDFMs are constantly engaging in continuing professional education and are interested in maintaining their certification, the ASMC has been working to **contact CDFMs that have not kept their certification current**. The policy requires the certification holder attain a minimum of 80 CPEs every two years, remit the renewal fee, and verify the accuracy of the renewal information by accepting the CDFM renewal terms and conditions.

**ASMC has been notifying individuals who have been awarded the CDFM** that the current policy, which inherently allows for a 2 year grace period, will change as of January 1, 2011. CDFM renewals that are processed before December 31, 2010, will not be subject to the new policy changes. Once the new policy is in effect, steeper renewal and reactivation fees, as well as possible retesting, will apply. CDFM renewals are randomly audited and you should be prepared to present supporting documentation if you are selected for a renewal audit. ## OLD IRONSIDES

## Little Known Tidbit of Naval History

Sometimes it is good to know the fabric of those we serve...

The **USS Constitution (Old Ironsides)**, as a combat vessel, carried 48,600 gallons of fresh water for her crew of 475 officers and men. This was sufficient to last six months of sustained operations at sea. She carried no evaporators (i.e. fresh water distillers).

However, let it be noted that according to her ship's log, "On **July 27, 1798**, the USS Constitution sailed from Boston with a full complement of **475 officers and men**, 48,600 gallons of fresh water, 7,400 cannon shot, 11,600 pounds of black powder, and 79,400 gallons of rum. Her mission: "**To destroy and harass English shipping.**"

Making **Jamaica** on 6 October, she took on 826 pounds of flour and 68,300 gallons of rum. Then she headed for **the Azores**, arriving there 12 November. She provisioned with 550 pounds of beef and 64,300 gallons of Portuguese wine. On 18 November, she set sail for **England**. In the ensuing days, she defeated five British men-of-war and captured and scuttled 12 English merchant ships, salvaging only the rum aboard each. By 26 January, her powder and shot were exhausted. Nevertheless, although unarmed she made a night raid up the Firth of Clyde in **Scotland**. Her landing party captured a whisky distillery and transferred 40,000 gallons of single malt Scotch aboard by dawn. Then she headed home. The USS Constitution arrived in **Boston** on 20 February 1799 with no cannon shot, no food, no powder, no rum, no wine, no whisky, and 38,600 gallons of water. **GO NAVY!**

## FROM THE DOCS' DESKS

### Sub Title

In accounting and finance we often hear about **the standard setting bodies for public accounting** (the Financial Accounting Standards Board – FASB) and state and local government accounting (Government Accounting Standards Board – GASB) being discussed. However, **what about the standard setting body for the federal government?**



The Constitution of the United States (Article I, Section 9) provides that **“No Money shall be drawn from the Treasury, but in Consequence of Appropriations made by Law; and a regular Statement and Account of the Receipts and Expenditures of all public Money shall be published from time to time.”** Over the years, various laws have subsequently provided supplementary accounting and reporting requirements and have provided **various public officials responsibilities for financial management**. One such law that we often hear about at the Defense Finance Accounting Service (DFAS) is the **Chief Financial Officers (CFO) Act of 1990**, as amended by the Government Management Reform Act of 1994. The CFO Act for the first time **required annual, audited financial statements for the U.S. Government** and its reporting entities. The Act also established the Chief Financial Officer position in each department to ensure the development of integrated agency accounting and financial management systems, including financial reporting and internal controls, which comply with applicable accounting principles, standards, and requirements, and internal control standards. This left the question, **who should set accounting standards for the U.S. Government.**

In conjunction with the 1990 CFO Act, the Secretary of the Treasury, the Director of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), and the Comptroller General established the Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB) to develop the **“applicable accounting principles”** for the newly required financial statements. During 1999, a task force of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) reviewed the Board’s policies and procedures to assess their conformance with AICPA’s criteria for designating bodies that promulgate GAAP. The Sponsors made certain changes in procedures necessary to conform to the Institute’s criteria. In October 1999 AICPA’s Council designated **FASAB** as the body that promulgates GAAP for federal entities in the United States. In the near future, FASAB will have to deal with the issue of **International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS)**, we thought a little background on the FASAB would be helpful.

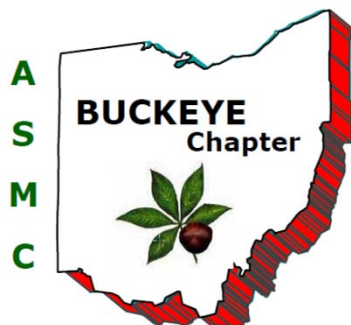
