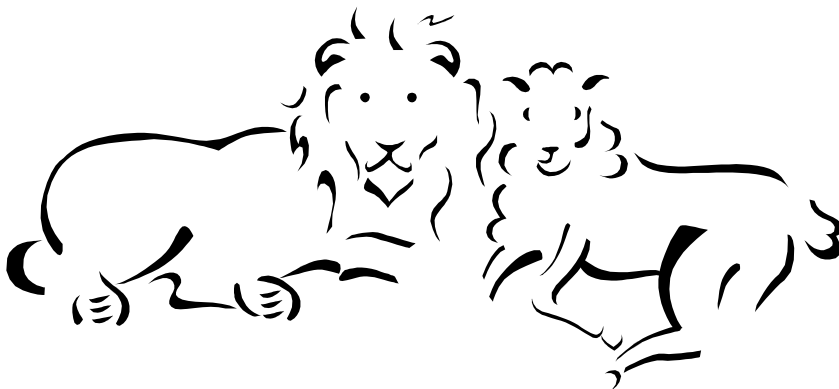

FEBRUARY LUNCHEON

Did you know that **H&R Block** has been in the tax business for **50 years** which is longer than anyone else in the business? H&R Block has been in business since 1955 and has served over 2.8 million customers since 2008. It has 13,000+ tax offices and online resources. H&R Block agents are required to **update their tax certifications annually** with some agents certified to do IRA audits!

Tax Planning. Your tax return starts with your Withholding Income Tax Statement commonly known as the W4 form. You must file either single, married or head of household and state the number of exemptions on the form.

A common misconception about exemptions is thinking they are for the number of dependents. What you place on the W4 determines if you want to break even or if you want money back from your income taxes. A rule of thumb is the **more exemptions** you claim, the **less withholding** from your income taxes. An interesting fact that our presenter shared is that if you are single and live in Ohio you pay more taxes! Ms. Hamilton recommended that when preparing your income tax return consider any life changes that may have occurred within the last tax year. There is a little reprieve this tax year. President Obama signed the "**Making Work Pay Credit**" bill effective only for tax years 2009 and 2010 with a maximum credit of \$400 and \$800 for joint filers. Keep in mind that this benefit is not paid as an advance credit and may reduce your refund or your balance due.

Ms. Hamilton recommended **reviewing your W4** if you are Dependent, Have more than one job, You and spouse work, Have other sources of income,

Ms. Hamilton explained that you **file where you work and pay where you live**. She also provided additional write-off tips for people who have their own business. Her presentation was followed by an informative question and answer period.

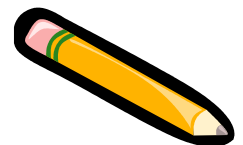
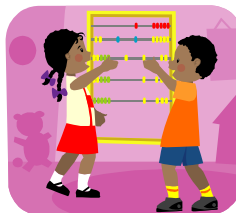
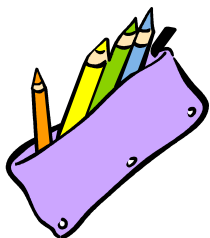

Have You Renewed Your Certification Within The Last 2 Years?

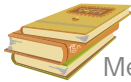
According to Ms Claudia Carr, Associate Director for **Certification at American Society of Military Comptrollers, ASMC** is changing their Certified Defense Financial Managers (CDFM) renewal policy. In an effort to ensure that CDFMs are constantly engaging in continuing professional education and are interested in maintaining their certification, the ASMC has been working to **contact CDFMs that have not kept their certification current**. The policy requires the certification holder attain a minimum of 80 CPEs every two years, remit the renewal fee, and verify the accuracy of the renewal information by accepting the CDFM renewal terms and conditions.

ASMC has been notifying individuals who have been awarded the CDFM that the current policy, which inherently allows for a 2 year grace period, will change as of January 1, 2011. CDFM renewals that are processed before December 31, 2010, will not be subject to the new policy changes. Once the new policy is in effect, steeper renewal and reactivation fees, as well as possible retesting, will apply. CDFM renewals are randomly audited and you should be prepared to present supporting documentation if you are selected for a renewal audit. 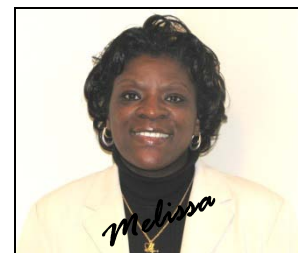

FROM THE DOCS' DESKS

Standards For Small Business

Another "Blue Ribbon" panel established a year ago by the **Financial Accounting Foundation (FAF)**, which is the parent organization of the **Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB)**, the **American Institute of Certified Public Accountants**, and the **National Association of State Boards of Accountancy** has recommended that a new set of accounting standards be developed for private companies.

The new stand will be based on the **United States Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP)**. The panel also recommended that a separate private-company rulemaking board be established separate from the FASB, which currently writes and revises U.S. GAAP.

The primary focus on establishing a private-company version of GAAP is to make **accounting rules** "relevant" to **private firms** by excising unnecessary measurement requirements and transaction disclosures. Over the years, preparers and auditors of private-company financial statements have sought a **private-company GAAP**, insisting that the full set of rules is **too complex**, and therefore costly and **burdensome**, for smaller nonpublic companies to apply.

Although private companies are **not required to file financial results** using GAAP, many do so at the request of investors and lenders who are more comfortable assessing GAAP-prepared statements. Other private companies use GAAP because they intend to go public, and investment banks that handle initial public offerings prefer consistency in reporting. Those favoring these new standards say private-company investors and lenders **do not** need the **same level of detail** that the Securities and Exchange Commission requires from publicly help companies.

The final product, sometimes now called "**little GAAP**" will be designed to be a pared-down version of the full set of GAAP rules, requiring fewer disclosures and less-detailed measurements of some assets and liabilities. How this will interface with the current efforts to convert the world to International Financial Reporting Standards remains to be seen.

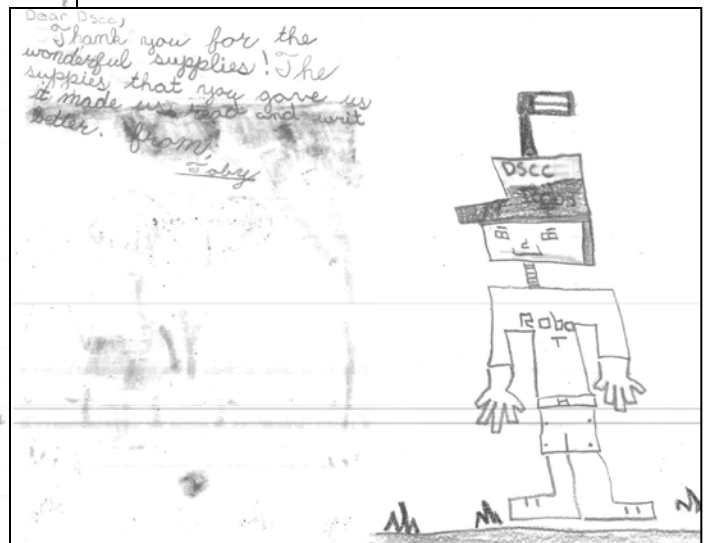
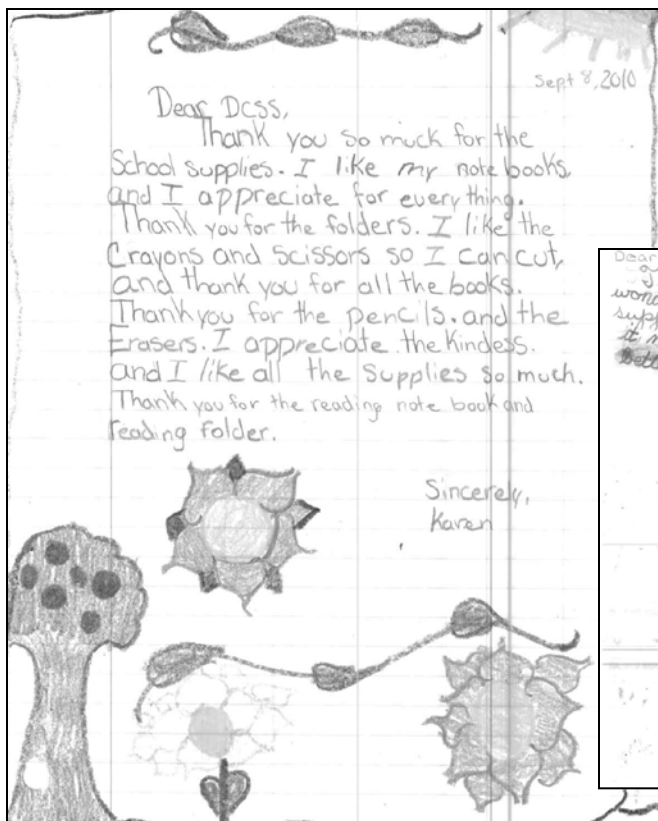

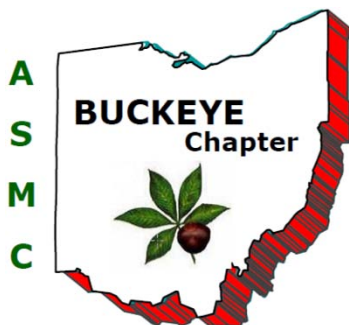
